Comma rules

1. Use commas to separate (= trennen) independent clauses when they are linked with and, but, for, or, nor (= noch, auch nicht), so, yet.

The game was over, but the people didn't go home.

2. Use commas after introductory clauses, phrases, and words that come before the main clause.

Now, I go home. While I was eating, the cat ran away.

3. Use commas to seperate three or more words in a series.

The car is cheap, nice, and fast.

4. No comma before because and that
